

Year 7

- Local area – Bootle looking at statistical data including Age, gender, marriage rates, race, religions, sex
- Europe and the European Union – Benefits of the European Union – regulations no discrimination and all protected characteristics, what does it mean to be British – why people voted to leave -
- Africa – race, religion, Empires and colonialism in Africa
- Asia – gender equality, race religion comparisons between Africa and Asia

Year 8

- Earthquakes – Boxing day tsunami
- Weather and climate - risk assessments – disability impacts how to overcome
- Development – world bank resources, same sex marriage rates across the world and links to levels of development
- Tourism – Issues arising from tourists – religion covering of shoulders etc, problems for people with disabilities

- Natural hazards – how wealth has impacts on responses to natural disasters, how natural hazards can impact on countries levels of development
- The living world – how rainforests & hot deserts can be managed sustainably having little impact on the indigenous people
- The urban world – how internal migration impacts of Rio de Janeiro, what impacts international events such as the world cup and Olympics can have on people.

- The changing economic world – how religion and development levels can cause conflicts within Nigeria. The impacts that TNC's have on local inhabitants when pollution is created.
- Urban change in the UK – How location has impacts on social inequality such as education, life expectancy, health and wealth
- Uneven development – how location across the world and how religion, emancipation of women have impacts on the population and structure of the population on developed and developing countries. Issues surrounding the stigma on migration.
- How the UK has impacted on the wider world, how colonialism has caused countries to develop slower and how aid is best distributed to these countries
- Resource management – how conflicts can occur over lack of access to resources such as water
