Last night was our annual Remembrance Evening, which was a truly stunning way to remember those who sacrificed so much for us. Again more details will follow next week.


If you don't already, please make sure you follow us on Twitter to get the up to date photos of all the fantastic opportunities our pupils have.

Anti-Bullying Week—Monday 11th - 15th November 2019

This week is National Anti Bullying Week and as ever pupils and staff have been raising the profile of anti-bullying within our school community.

A number of events took place this week to recognise Anti-Bullying Week including:

- Jessica Holden and Jack Redmond, both from Year 9, represented Hillside at Sefton's Anti Bullying Conference on Tuesday 12th November.
- Blue Ribbons have been on sale for 20p for pupils to wear during the week to show their support and recognition for Anti-Bullying Week
- The Progress Leaders held a cake sale for pupils during break and lunch on Thursday.
- We held our second Kindness Afternoon Tea please see the additional article in the newsletter about this.

In Magic Breakfast pupils worked with Mrs McGing to think about what the word 'friend' means and how we can become better friends to each other. We are very fortunate at Hillside to have young people who, for the majority, are extremely kind and respectful to their peers and as a consequence, incidents of bullying are rare at Hillside. However, we are aware that as within any school, bullying can occur and the impact on a young person who experiences any form of bullying can be very upsetting and damaging. The following 'Tips for Parents' are provided by the Anti-Bullying Alliance who are a registered charity that work hard to promote the anti-bullying message to young people.

If your child is being bullied don't panic. Explain to your child that the bullying is not their fault and together you will sort this out.

- Bullying is never acceptable; and should always be taken seriously. It is never your child's fault if they've been bullied.
- Try and establish the facts. It can be helpful to keep a diary of events. If the bullying is online, save or copy images and text.
- Find out what your child wants to happen. Help to identify steps you can take; and the skills they have to help sort out the situation. Make sure you always keep them informed about any actions you decide to take.
- You may be tempted to tell your child to retaliate but this can have unpredictable results. Your child might get into trouble or get even more hurt. Rather role play non-violent ways they can respond to children that are bullying them (e.g. 'I don't like it when you say that to me / do that to me. Stop.'); show them how to block or unfriend people if the bullying is online and help them identify other or adults that can support them.
- Encourage your child to get involved in activities that build their confidence and esteem, and help them to form friendships outside of school (or wherever the bullying is taking place).

May we take this opportunity to remind all pupils, parents and guardians that bullying of any form will not be tolerated within our school community and if you ever have any concerns in relation to a young person being bullied please ensure that you contact your child's Progress Leader. Mrs Cross
