

Concrete Lighting

Year 10 have been working on a 'concrete lighting' brief in their DT lessons. The pupils have learned about the composite material and how altering the ratio of the mix (sand, aggregate, cement and water) can achieve different outcomes. They then had to create a design that they could mould the concrete in, that would provide the main structure to their light and then develop this into a working prototype. Cycle Safety

A small number of pupils are choosing to commute to and from school on their bikes. As the dark nights are now here can we please urge all pupils to take note of the cycling safety tips below:

- Always ride on the **left** side of the street in the same direction as the traffic.
- Never ride against traffic.
- Try to use bike lanes or designated bike routes whenever you can.
- Always stop and check for traffic in both directions when leaving your driveway, an alley, or a curb. Some people in cars just don't see cyclists.
- Watch traffic closely for turning cars or cars pulling out of driveways.
- Don't ride too closely to parked cars doors can open suddenly!
- Stop at all stop signs and obey red lights just as cars do.
- If you're cycling with friends, ride single file.
- If you ride when it's dark, be sure to have reflectors on your bike and battery-operated lights.
- Don't wear headphones while cycling you need to hear what's going on around you.
- Never change direction or change lanes without first looking behind you and using the correct hand signals. That way everyone knows where you're going.

Can we also remind parents/guardians and pupils that if pupils choose to bring their bikes to school whilst we do have facilities for pupils to store their bikes when bikes are secured by pupils the school accepts no responsibility for them and has no insurance to cover any loss or damage to bikes left on school site.
