
Liverpool Playhouse

Pupil Safety

I would like to take this opportunity to remind pupils of some basics in terms of keeping themselves safe over the school holiday.

When out and about:

- Don't go out alone there is safety in numbers.
- Always let an adult know where you are going.
- Never go anywhere with someone you don't know.

Staying Safe Online:

- Private stuff needs protection (if you wouldn't want you parents or grandparents to see something, don't post it). 1.

- 3. What you share will always be there (think before you post).
- Not everyone online is who they say they are (remember that behind the screen it is easy to pretend to be someone 4. vou are not).
- 5. If something doesn't feel right, tell a trusted adult.


You are their favourite thing at Christmas!
