### **Homework and Pupil Planners**

Based on feedback from staff, pupils and parents we will no longer be using Show My Homework to set homework and all homework will instead be explained in lessons by teachers and written into pupil planners. Although this was a very difficult decision to make as we appreciate that for a number of parents, Show My Homework was a great tool to be able to keep track of what homework your child had, it was becoming increasingly difficult for a number of our pupils to use the system to stay on top of their homework and be organised. All pupils have now been given a new, termly planner. Pupils will receive a new planner at the start of each term and will be expected to bring their planner to school each day and use it in every lesson. If pupils lose their planners they can purchase a new one from the finance office for £2.

Planners will also be used to log rewards that pupils receive from teachers for

demonstrating aspects of the Hillside Way. Pupils will receive 5 points per reward which they can use to buy items from the school stationery shop or save up to take part in rewards events such as: trips out or pizza and movie afternoons. Pupils will also be rewarded for their attendance, punctuality and their effort in lessons.



### Years 7 and 8

We have a new and exciting homework programme for pupils in year 7 and 8. Pupils are now given weekly numeracy and literacy homework and subject projects. Approximately every 4 weeks, pupils will be given a project from a different subject area (e.g. history). The homework project will consist of a number of different tasks that pupils have to complete each week. Some of the exiting projects already planned are: the design a lab coat project for science and a castle building project in history. All homework for year 7 and 8 is detailed in the pupil planner and class teachers will give out more instructions in lessons for their specific subject project.

### Years 9, 10 and 11

Pupils in these year groups will be given homework according to the departmental timetable which, is generally once a week for core subjects and once every two weeks for option subjects. Teachers will explain homework in lessons and pupils will write this down in their pupil planners. Pupils should check their planners each evening to see what homework is due that week.

## Hillside High School—GCSE Exams 2019

It has been year of excellent results at Hillside for our Class of 2019. The top ten performers achieved 62 top 9-7 grades in the 9-1 GCSE system.

There were outstanding individual performances, including Tommy Weng Mei, who achieved ten 9 – 8 grades, four of which were grade 9s! Abbie Maginness-Limb, John McGarvey and Carlie Milburn all achieved five 9-8 grades – a stunning academic achievement!

Over a third of Hillside pupils achieved at least one of the top grades across their subjects, with 128 top grades achieved overall.

Performance in English and Maths has improved again this year, with over 65% of pupils achieving grades 9 -4 English and 60% in Maths. Across the curriculum there have been some excellent results. In the separate sciences, over 95% of pupils achieved 9-4 grades, with 53% of pupils in Chemistry achieving the top grades. Results at 9-4 in Art, Business Studies, Design Technology, Retail Business, Sport Studies and 3D Sculpture all exceeded 80% - representing excellence across the curriculum.

21% of all Hillside pupils achieved the challenging English Baccalaureate qualification, which is a fantastic achievement.

This has been another excellent year for our pupils at Hillside. Their hard work and efforts coupled with the support of parents and teachers has allowed them to achieve results they should be proud of. It has been my absolute pleasure to have known and worked with these fantastic young people, the whole school community is proud of their successes and I wish them all of the best as they pursue new courses in the future.
