

Hegarty Maths

Hegarty maths is a fabulous website which allows you to further develop your maths knowledge. For every maths topic, there are videos to help you and then questions for you to try. Year 7 and Year 8 pupils are expected to complete a minimum of 20 minutes of Hegarty maths work each week. Year 9, 10 and 11 pupils; your teachers will be setting weekly tasks for you to complete.


In all pupil planners there is a Hegarty maths reward page. For every 5 hours you complete, you will receive a stamp and for every stamp you have, you will be given a raffle ticket to go into our 'Big Hegarty Raffle Prize Draw' which will be drawn once a half term.

From next week, the pupils who have completed the most Hegarty maths in each year group will be displayed in the newsletter. The top pupils across the whole school will also gain a place on our 'Ultimate Hegarty maths team' and will be added to the football display on the maths corridor.

For those who are unsure of how to log in to the website: you need to click on student log in, type in our school name, fill in your name and date of birth and then your password. If you have forgotten your password, click the reset button and your teacher will reset this for you. Year 7 pupils, your teachers will be giving you a Hegarty maths lesson to go through this in more detail.

Last year we had many Year 11 pupils who were able to improve their GCSE grade by using Hegarty maths, some even improved by 3 GCSE grades.

Punctuality

To maintain our standards and expectations and to improve whole school punctuality we will be challenging pupils who arrive late to school. Arriving late to school not only has a negative impact on the learning of the pupil who has arrived late to school but can also disrupt the teaching and learning of others.

We want all of our pupils to create good habits for life and maximise their opportunities for learning at all times and it is for these reasons that we will be tackling those pupils who arrive late to school. As you are aware, school starts at 8.45 a.m. and pupils should be in form, ready for the register to be taken at this point.

Any pupil who arrives after 8.45 a.m. will need to fill in a 'late slip' explaining the reason for the lateness. This slip will then be sent home in the post to inform parents/guardians of the reason for lateness and the time of arrival. There will be further consequences and conversations with home for those pupils who are frequently late to school.

Safeguarding

Welcome back to our weekly Safeguarding Article. We trust that you have all had a fun, safe and happy summer and a good first week of term. This week we wanted to remind pupils and parents/guardians of the Safeguarding Team at Hillside (see poster opposite).

If one of our Safeguarding Team is informed about a pupil being at risk of harm, or there are concerns over a child's welfare or emotional wellbeing, we will always endeavour to discuss these concerns with parents/guardians first and try to offer support and advice when appropriate. Occasionally, school will need to refer to outside agencies for additional advice or support and we would discuss this with families first, with the rare exception where this may cause further harm to a pupil.

We have started the year reminding all pupils about the need to stay safe online and on the first day pupils had a session from their Form Tutors reminding them of the basics of e-safety and what they should do in the event of a concern. If any pupils or parents/ guardians think that school needs to be aware of any issues that occurred over the summer holidays that may have an impact in school then I would urge parents to contact one of our Safeguarding Team, even if just for information sharing purposes.

The new term can be an exciting time of year for pupils but can also be stressful for a variety of reasons. May we take this opportunity to remind pupils and parents/guardians that if there are any concerns
