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Year 8—Virtual First Aid Course

Last week Year 8 participated in a virtual First Aid course delivered by students from the University of Liverpool Medical School. In the session we were shown what to do in an emergency and how to provide the basics of First Aid. We were guided through scenarios, such as finding someone unwell on the street, helping someone injured at school and knowing how to call for assistance. The three students taught us how to keep airways clear, put people in the recovery position and we were even shown how to do CPR to the tune of "Staying Alive" by the Bee Gees.



The final part of the session was a Q&A session about life at

University, with pupils having the chance to ask questions to the students. We learnt a lot about how hard the students of medicine have been working through the Coronavirus pandemic, as they continued studying and working in the labs analysing tests and supporting the local community. 

Behaviour in the Local Community

We have been asked to share information regarding anti-social incidents of vandalism within South Park over the last few weeks. Whilst we have not had evidence of our pupils being directly involved, this message is being shared with young people across the local community, with a clear message that any vandalism or damage to the local parks is not acceptable.

We pride ourselves in the vast majority of our pupils whose behaviour both in and out of school is exemplary and we have so many young people who are positive role models both within school and the local community.

As a school we would like to remind pupils that our Behaviour for Learning policy does stress that we will deal with any antisocial behaviour from our pupils both on the way to and from school. When wearing our school uniform pupils are representing Hillside High School and we will not have our reputation compromised by any inappropriate behaviour.

Attendance

As we have explained in our newsletter before, attendance to school is now mandatory and as such our attendance drive to ensure that pupils are in school regularly is very much part of our daily routine.

Pupils should be in school every day to maximise their learning opportunity to support their friendships and social aspects of school life.

If your child is unable to attend school you will need to ring the school office on **0151 525 2630** between **8.00-8.30am**. Your call will be received by one of our admin team who will discuss with you the reason for your child's absence.

*Please be aware that dependent on the reason and your child's current attendance there will be some challenge as to why your child is not able to come to school.

Each day at 9.30am the pastoral team will meet and establish who is absent and the reason why. Again, dependent on the reason for the absence and the pupil's previous attendance record the most likely outcome for a pupil absence would be a home visit conducted by one of our Attendance Officers, our Safeguarding Officers or the pupil's Progress Leader. On occasion where we have significant concerns about a pupil absence, we will refer to the Local Authority Education Welfare Officer (EWO).

We must stress that any conversations around attendance will be supportive and with the aim of working together to ensure pupils can come into school regularly feeling safe, happy and ready to learn.

We would like to take this opportunity to thank all our parents/guardians and pupils who have made a significant effort in terms of attendance over the last few weeks. If you wish to discuss any aspect of this information please contact your child's Progress Leader, Mrs Tattersall, Attendance Officer or me.

If your child or anyone in the household has COVID -19 symptoms please follow NHS guidance which can be found on our website.
