UKMT Junior Maths Challenge Results

Each year we enter some of our highest achieving mathematicians into the UKMT maths challenge. The challenge takes place across the country with thousands of schools taking part. On Wednesday 28th April, 30 of our year 7 and 8 pupils took part in the Junior challenge which was held online this year.

Many of the pupils involved used the resource booklets that they were given to practice answering past questions in order to prepare for the challenge and the whole maths department is really proud of the effort that they all put in!

I have just received the results for the challenge and would like to say a massive 'Well done!' to all of the pupils but in particular:

Ruby Brown, Ruby Fleming and Jakob Charman who all achieved a Bronze award and Jessica Harrington who managed to achieve a Gold award. This is the first time that one of our pupils has achieved a Gold award in the Junior UKMT which is just fantastic!! Only the top 6% of the country receive a gold award, 13% a silver and 21% a bronze so we are very proud of all of the pupils!

We look forward to entering the challenge again next year!



Standards & Expectations at Hillside High School

Outdoor Coats and Blazers

Outdoor coats/jackets are not part of your school uniform and should not be worn in the school building:

Take your coat off as you enter school in the morning.

If you wear your coat to go out at break and lunch then you should not put this on until you are outside.



Blazers ...

Blazers are to be worn on the corridors at all times and this is not optional.

When you get into your classroom then you can take your blazer off but this must be put back on before you leave.

If it is exceptionally warm then Mrs Ryan as the Principal of the school will decide on the wearing of blazers. Unless you are told by a member of staff then you continue to wear your blazer on sunny days as well.

Jewellery and Nail Varnish

- Jewellery is not allowed in school including earrings this is for health and safety reasons and items should not be brought into school
- Nail varnish is not allowed in school and if you are wearing nail varnish you will be asked to remove it and if false nails are worn pupils may be withdrawn from lessons if the nails can not be removed.

From Monday 7th June any pupil who is found wearing jewellery will have it confiscated by a member of staff.





Mobile Phones and Earphones

- Mobile phones should only be used in 'phone zones' such as the yard, field, the old gym and at break and lunch.
- Phones should not be used to call people or take photos or videos.
- Earphones should not be used around school unless as part of a lesson and permission has been given as part of that lesson requirement.
