









Reminders

Year 7 became only the second ever year group to take part in Project: Lab Shirt, a homework project designed by the science department to help engage pupils creatively and imaginatively. This culminated in pupils being allowed to come



in on Friday 8th October without having to wear their blazer but instead, a lab shirt that they had designed over a four-week period, to coincide with our World Space Week celebrations. It has to be said that the response and effort from the year group was phenomenal. Some of the designs were stunning and a number of pupils (and parents) had clearly gone to significant lengths to make their shirts stand out from the crowd. We had 3D planet designs, DNA molecules, chemical reactions, periodic tables and plenty of fantastically mad scientists.

We were fortunate enough to get the whole year group together to take part in the Hillside Space Station Challenge. Working in groups, pupils were provided with just spaghetti and marshmallows and tasked with designing the tallest space station they could in just 25 minutes. The results were varied it has to be said, but the effort, enthusiasm and teamwork was outstanding resulting in us choosing two winning teams who each received a trophy for their work. We were also fortunate enough to be able to award some individual prizes for lab shirt designs; Oskar Karpiak, Xavier Karpiak, Michael Pealing, Lillie Carrol, Tia Leicester, Ruby Murray, Sophie Parsonage and Sophie Lamb all came in colourful, creative and detailed shirts, so congratulations to them. 





This week in assembly Mrs Cross has been reminding pupils about 'Standards and Expectations'. The emphasis has been around all pupils following 'The Hillside Way' all the time. As we head towards the end of the first half term, we felt it timely that pupils were reminded about the basics.

Key things were mentioned, reminding pupils of how to get the best from their lessons and to ensure that every teacher has the right to teach, and every pupil has the right to learn. Pupils were also reminded of the need to arrive to all lessons on time and to ensure that they go to the toilet at break and lunch and not during lessons unless in a real emergency. Pupils were also reminded that they need a school bag big enough for an A4 folder every day along with their Essential 8.

Finally, reminders were given about uniform and our expectations in terms of wearing full school uniform and not wearing outdoor coats indoors and no jewellery including stud earrings.

Most of our pupils work tirelessly to meet our high expectations to ensure that they follow 'The Hillside Way' every day. What can pupils expect from each lesson?

 Your teacher will greet you at the door of every lesson and monitor the behaviour on the corridor outside of their classroom.

•You will stand behind your chair and wait to be seated, when you sit down get your pencil case out and be ready for learning.

You will sit in the seating plan that the teacher has created.

•At the end of the lesson you will be asked to stand behind your chair before being dismissed orderly These are non-negotiables.
