#### Tuition at Hillside - Excellence in Learning

The additional support offered to pupils this year has gone from strength to strength and includes:

- -Every KS3 pupil receiving a license to access Bedrock for this academic year and next.
- -Every KS4 pupil receiving a license to access GCSE POD.
- -Saturday School for Year 11
- -Period 6 sessions for Year 11
- -Reading interventions
- -LRC open before school, break, lunch and after school for study support

I am really pleased in this newsletter to introduce you to our in school tuition team. This is something new we have in place this year to provide an additional layer of learning support for pupils after the disruption caused by COVID. Our tuition team work full time tutoring our pupils for English, Maths and science both during the school day and before and after school. We also have a team of Teaching Assistants who this year have been trained to deliver reading tuition to pupils and this takes place after school. We also have a team of tutors delivering virtual tuition sessions to Year 10 and 11 in English and Maths.

Our focus is clear at Hillside - learning is our core business. We know how hard it has been for our pupils to learn during COVID times. We have built new systems and teams to provide on site tuition and virtual tuition to maximise pupils learning.




# **GCSE Pods**

#### **Reading is Power at Hillside**

Our curriculum intent consists of three core strands: Knowledge Led, Diversity and Reading is Power. Each strand permeates every element of our curriculum during lesson times, registrations and after school activities.

The Summer Term started with our KS3 Book Launch: The Unforgotten Coat. Who better to launch our new form novel than the author himself Frank Cottrell Boyce. Frank exchanged 'first day at school' stories before sharing his own "I kicked a nun" story. Pupils then had the opportunity to listen to Frank read an extract from his book to launch the Summer Term form novel.

Following the assemblies, pupils all returned to make a start on their new novel with their form tutor.

Frank then met our Reading Reps and awarded them their new Reading Rep badges. By breaktime of the first day back we already had a new pupils wanting to become a Reading Rep.








This term our Year 7, 8 and 9 will all read The Unforgotten Coat with their form tutors and engage with guided reading strategies to develop comprehension and inference. Our Year 10 pupils will have a chosen novel which linked to diversity and inclusivity. Our Year 11 pupils will not have a Summer Term form novel but will now be focusing on GCSE POD in their registrations in preparation for their end of year exams.

## Who is Frank Cottrell Boyce?

Frank Cottrell Boyce is a children's novelist who won the Carnegie Medal for his first book -Millions - in 2004 and the Guardian Children's Fiction Prize for The Unforgotten Coat in 2013. Millions was made into a film by Danny Boyle, for whom Frank went on to work as the writer on the London Olympics Opening Ceremony, 2012. His other books include Framed (filmed by the BBC), Cosmic and The Astounding Broccoli Boy. He also wrote the three official sequels to Chitty Chitty Bang Bang. His films include 24 Hour Party People, God on Trial and Hilary and Jackie. His short work, The Great Rocket Robbery, was published for World Book Day in 2019. His latest novel, Runaway Robot, was published by Macmillan in May 2019. Frank lives locally and works with lots of local

The reason we selected The Unforgotten Coat was from a recommendation from Charlotte, Mrs Ryan's daughter. Mrs Ryan then bought the book and passed it on to Mrs Wardale, who also loved the story. Mrs Ryan and Mrs Wardale knew this book would bring so much love and laughter to our pupils.



The characteristic trait we are thinking about this half term is Kindness. Kindness underpins everything we do as a school community. When we think about kindness we often Immediately think about how we can be kind to others. We might also think about how we can be kind to the planet and make a difference to the world around us. Often one of the hardest things to do, is to be kind to ourselves. We can be our toughest critic and that is so wrong!
