



News

During our Challenge Partners review last week, a group of pupils took part in a meeting with the visitors to share their views on Hillside. Our pupils spoke with passion about the provision they receive from our school. Some key points were that they appreciate their teachers and all they do for them, both in lesson time and outside the classroom. They could identify and explain Hillside Core Five pedagogical strategies such as retrieval (helping them to remember), and word rich (developing their understanding of tier 2 and 3 vocabulary) and were able to give clear examples of these from individual lessons. Pupils spoke of extra curricular provision such as the LRC, sports and performing arts clubs and the positive impact that teachers' support has had on their mental health. Pupils spoke with enthusiasm regarding the literature they are reading outside of the curriculum and their aspirations post Hillside. All pupils represented our school impeccably and it was heart warming to hear the impact of those who work at Hillside acknowledged and appreciated by those who we do it for.

Attendance Focus

This week our thought for the week was:

'There's no time like the present, and no substitute for being present.'

As we move towards the end of the year it is still not too late for pupils to improve upon their current attendance, and it is vital that they attend school everyday to avoid losing vital learning time and opportunities. There is a clear link between pupils' attendance and their overall final GCSE grades.

We would like to give the community some reminders of our systems:

If your child is unable to attend school, you will need to ring the school office on 0151 525 2630 between 8.00-8.30am. Your call will be received by one of our admin team who can transfer you to our Attendance officer's where they will discuss with you the reason for your child's absence. Please be aware that dependant on the reason and your child's current attendance there will be some challenge as to why your child is not able to come to school. Each day at 9.30am the pastoral team will meet and establish who is absent and the reason why. Dependant again on the individual's attendance and the reason for absence the most likely outcome will be a member of the pastoral team visiting the home of pupils who are absent to discuss how we can get the young person back into school with as limited time absent as possible.
