Standards & Expectations at Hillside High School

Outdoor Coats and Blazers

Outdoor coats/jackets are not part of your school uniform and should not be worn in the school building:

Take your coat off as you enter school in the morning.

If you wear your coat to go out at break and lunch then you should not put this on until you are outside



Blazers ...

Blazers are to be worn on the corridors at all times and this is not optional.

When you get into your classroom then you can take your blazer off but this must be put back on before you leave.

If it is exceptionally warm then Mrs Ryan as the Principal of the school will decide on the wearing of blazers. Unless you are told by a member of staff then you continue to wear your blazer on sunny days as well.

Jewellery and Nail Varnish

- Jewellery is not allowed in school including earrings this is for health and safety reasons and items should not be brought into school.
- Nail varnish is not allowed in school and if you are wearing nail varnish you will be asked to remove it and if false nails are worn pupils may be withdrawn from lessons if the nails can not be removed.

Any pupil who is found wearing jewellery will have it confiscated by a member of staff.



Mobile Phones and Earphones

- Mobile phones should only be used in 'phone zones' such as the yard, field, the old gym and at break and lunch.
- Phones should not be used to call people or take photos or videos.
- Earphones should not be used around school unless as part of a lesson and permission has been given as part of that lesson requirement.
