Safeguarding, Emotional Wellbeing and Mental Health **British Science Week**


The focus of this week's assemblies has been British Science Week. To celebrate the 30th anniversary of British Science Week pupils have been completing a number of 'Time' themed challenges.


During form time pupils have been trying to figure out the order of events for the history of the universe. Each form class had to work as a team to put the following order of events into chronological order, winners will be announced next week.


