Pupil Support

A reminder that if your child takes medication during the school day then this should be brought into school and clearly labelled with pharmacy instructions for administering the medicine. Except for any inhalers or in some cases an epi-pen, a pupil should not carry any medication on them in school including paracetamol. If we held medication for your child last year, please contact school to check that we have enough stock and that it is in date. If your child has an ongoing medical condition and requires a care plan, please contact Mrs Banks who will work with you to create or update this.


Attendance—Start Strong


It is so important to make a strong start to the year. In this week's assemblies we have been outlining why attendance is so important and the effect it can have life chances.

We have also introduced Compulsory Catch-up to help support pupils when they return from an absence.

Compulsory Catch-up

- •To support your progress, if you miss curriculum time, you will be required to complete Compulsory Catch Up to support your learning and reduce any knowledge gaps.
- •In the event of missing curriculum time, you will have until Friday of the week following your absence to complete any work that was missed, and ensure your teacher has signed it off as complete.
- •It is your responsibility to identify and complete any work that has been missed. You must present your catch-up sheet to your Form Tutor on the Friday of the week following your absence. If all work has not been completed, you will be required to stay behind where you will be supported by staff to complete your catch-up work.





Meet the Attendance Team

We are lucky to have a dedicated attendance team to support you and you families in attending school. No matter what the reason for an absence is, every day of school missed is 5 hours of learning missed that cannot be caught up.

The attendance team are responsible for monitoring and support on a daily basis, this may include phone calls home, home visits or direct work with pupils and their families. Our Attendance Team also works with pupils 1:1 regarding attendance and hold attendance workshops.

If you are unable to attend school your parent/guardian will need to ring the school office on 0151 525 2630 between 7.30-8.30am and explain your absence to one of the team.

Standards and Expectations—School Uniform

Firstly, a huge thank you to all our parents/guardians and pupils who have started the school year looking so smart and wearing our school uniform with pride. We don't take this for granted and we still regularly receive compliments from the wider local community about how smart Hillside pupils look.

Please see below for some basic reminders regarding school uniform and our expectations.

- · Girls should wear white socks or black tights
- · Jewellery is not permitted including any piercings. If pupils are seen wearing jewellery the teacher will confiscate this and the item will be placed in the school safe.
- Make- up should be minimal and discreet and false eye lashes, false nails and or nail varnish should not be worn. Pupils will be provided with wipes and nail varnish remover if they arrive in school with either.
- · Blazers should be always worn on the corridors pupils may remove blazers when working in classrooms.
- Outdoor coats or hooded jackets are not allowed to be worn in school and they should be removed as pupils enter the school building at any points during the school day e.g. after break and lunch.
 Our uniform underpins our high expectations of pupils to follow 'The Hillside Way' and pupils should look smart, professional and ready to learn- which many do every single day.
