






What an Inspiration!

"Hello everyone, my name is Miss Wharton and I was a pupil at Hillside from September 2010 to June 2015.

Whilst in Year 9, along with several other pupils I was chosen to be photographed for the school's prospectus which I was happy to do, especially as I was asked to participate in the Science Department photographs. My family were very proud, but also found it hilarious that my face was on the back of buses and on billboards around Bootle.

At the end of Year 9 I chose Separate Sciences as one of my GCSE options, as at this time I wanted to pursue a career in Veterinary Science. As part of the Class of 2015, I was in Mrs Ryan's first GCSE cohort following her appointment to Principal in 2013.

After my time at Hillside, I went on to study A-Levels in Biology, Maths, and Psychology, and an AS-Level in Chemistry. Psychology A-Level sparked a fascination of the Science of Learning, but I was still set on a career that involved working with animals. Whilst looking around different Universities I was introduced to a field called Zoology which involved studying animal behaviour, conservation, and disease. This seemed like the perfect course for me, and I was delighted to be accepted by LJMU to study a Bachelor of Science.

During my time at LJMU COVID hit, and like many people it forced me to re-evaluate my future path as a life of travelling the world, working as a Conservationist just like my hero David Attenborough was now looking unlikely. I wasn't sure what my path was going to be, but I knew it had to involve Science. Upon graduating I was made aware of a job opportunity at Hillside to become an Academic Mentor of Science. I started this role in September 2022, and within a short space of time realised how much I loved passing my passion for Science onto younger members of my community.

Supporting Year 11s through their GCSEs and working closely with colleagues, who not so long ago were my own Science teachers, helped me make the decision to follow a career in teaching. I was lucky enough to complete my Teacher Training here at Hillside from September 2023, and even luckier to have been appointed as a Teacher of Science from September 2024.

And just to really bring my story to full circle, those pictures that were taken of me in Year 9 were taken in what is now my very own classroom.

I hope to inspire all our pupils to work hard, be resilient, adapt to change, and trust process – you never know what life has in store for you. Oh, and watch more David Attenborough!"
