If your attendance is already above 96% it just needs to stay that way!



Mentors in Violence Prevention

This week, 18 Year 10 pupils took part in training to become Mentors in Violence Prevention. This training helped prepare them to deliver a bespoke peer education programme of sessions to our Year 8 pupils by equipping them with the language and framework to explore and challenge the attitudes, beliefs and cultural norms that underpin gender-based violence, bullying and other forms of abuse, while building resilience and promoting positive mental health.

The MVP programme explores a series of scenarios involving a range of behaviours, such as labelling, hate crime, manipulation and online abuse. Using a bystander approach, individuals are not considered potential victims or perpetrators; instead, they are empowered to be active bystanders with the ability to support and challenge their peers in a safe way.

Our Year 10 pupils were fantastic throughout the two days they took part and are already looking forward to delivering the sessions they trained in. Lucy, the MVP trainer, was extremely complimentary of our pupils and thinks they'll do an amazing job. One pupil commented that the programme "Taking part in the training really helped me change my mindset and educated me so that I can support younger pupils at Hillside".

They will also be given the opportunity to attend a graduation ceremony with mentors from other Merseyside schools next year. Well done to all!





Human Rights Day



Mr Edwards went through the Human Rights Act that provides freedoms for people in this country and also highlighted that in some countries people were not so fortunate. He shared the education protocol:
