## **Holocaust Memorial Day**

This week's assemblies have been focused on the extremely important theme of Holocaust Memorial Day. This event is marked annually on the 27th January which is particularly poignant this year as we commemorate the 80th anniversary of the liberation of Auschwitz-Birkenau in 1945.

Pupils were reminded that this is a time to remember the millions of people murdered during the Holocaust, under Nazi Persecution and in the genocides that followed in Cambodia, Rwanda, Bosnia and Darfur.

In assemblies we discussed the theme of this year's Holocaust Memorial Day, For a Better Future, and the idea that genocide doesn't just happen on its own and is a steady process which can begin if discrimination, racism and hatred are not checked and prevented. We are also commemorating HMD at Hillside with 28 of our Year 9 pupils taking part in a community event at the Plaza Cinema in Waterloo, where they will watch an animated version of "The Diary of Anne Frank" which tells the story of a little girl and her family who hide desperately from the Nazis to avoid persecution.

There is still so much to do for everyone and HMD is an ideal opportunity to start this process as we honour the experiences of those people who suffered and challenge ourselves to work for a safer, better future.
