But did you know that 1 in 5 children don't have a book at home? And 1 in 7 primary schools in England have no library space at all, affecting more than 750,000 children.


It's time to #rebuildthelibrary.

Understanding Attachment and Trauma: A Guide for Parents

At Hillside High School, we are committed to being a trauma-aware community, a place where every child feels safe, supported, and understood. This means recognising how early experiences shape a child's ability to learn, connect, and thrive. We are currently working towards achieving The Bronze Attachment and Trauma Sensitive Schools Award (ATSSA).

What Is Attachment Theory?

Attachment theory explains how children form emotional bonds with the adults in their lives. When these bonds are secure, children feel safe to explore, learn, and build relationships. But when those early connections are disrupted through loss, neglect, or instability it can affect how a child behaves and copes with stress.

What Is Trauma?

Trauma isn't always about one big event. It can also come from ongoing stress or experiences that overwhelm a child's ability to cope. Examples include:

- Loss of a parent or caregiver
- Domestic violence or conflict at home
- Neglect or inconsistent caregiving
- Living in foster care or moving between homes
- Serious illness or hospital stays
- Witnessing or experiencing abuse
- Sudden life changes (e.g. moving schools or countries)



What Does a Trauma-Aware School Look Like?

We don't ask, "What's wrong with this child? "we ask, "What might have happened to this child?". We support pupils by:

- Having predictable routines each lesson such as our lesson transitions routine
- Responding calmly and consistently to behaviour such as walking calmly on the left on the corridors and using the Hillside Way as a visual tool for pupils.
- Offering safe spaces for emotional regulation such as our calm room.
- Building strong, trusting relationships with all staff
- Training staff to recognise and respond to trauma

How Can Parents Help?

You don't need to have all the answers just being a calm, consistent presence makes a big difference. Here's how you can help:

- Keep us informed. If your child has experienced something that might affect them, please let us know. Even small details can help us support them better.
- Reach out if you need help. If you're unsure how your child is coping or need extra support, contact us. We can offer mental health support or support for your family through projects such as Team Around the School.
- Work with us. When school and home work together, children feel more secure and understood.
