




Year 10 Geography Students Shine on Albert Dock Field Trip




Computer Science



Safeguarding, Emotional Wellbeing and Mental Health Stay Safe This Summer: Water Safety at Hillside High

As we head into the warmer summer months, it's natural to want to cool off and enjoy the outdoors—but this week's assembly reminded us that safety should always come first. At Hillside High, we've been shining a spotlight on water safety, ensuring all our pupils are informed and prepared to stay safe around open water.

Float to Live – A Life-Saving Message

The key message of our assembly was simple but vital: **Float to Live**. If you ever find yourself in trouble in

water, the most important thing to do is not to panic. Lie back, extend your arms and legs, and **float**. This gives your body time to adjust to the cold and can give rescuers a chance to reach you.

Hidden Dangers – What You Don't See Can Hurt You

We also discussed the dangers that might not be visible from the shore. Water can look calm and inviting, but it may hide strong undercurrents, sudden drops in depth, or submerged objects like rocks and debris. Jumping or diving into unknown water can lead to serious injury—or worse.

Cold Water Shock - A Real Risk

Even on a hot day, open water is often much colder than expected. Cold water shock can cause gasping, loss of control, and panic. Knowing how your body might react and staying calm by floating can be the difference between danger and safety.

What To Do In an Emergency

- Our assembly also covered how to help if someone else is in trouble.
 Remember:
- Don't jump in after them—you could become a second victim
- Shout for help and call 999.
- Look for something to throw to them, like a float or rope.

Final Thoughts

We're incredibly proud of how seriously our pupils have taken this important topic. As we approach the holidays, we want everyone to enjoy the break—but safely. Whether you're at the beach, by a river, or near a lake, remember what we've learned this week.


