A reminder that if your child takes medication during the school day then this should be brought into school and clearly labelled with pharmacy instructions for administering the medicine. Except for any inhalers or in some cases an epi-pen, a pupil should not carry any medication on them in school including paracetamol. If your child has an ongoing medical condition and requires a care plan, please contact Mrs Banks who will work with you to create or update this.
