We are very proud to introduce our Student Councillors for the academic year 2025-26! These Pupil Leaders were elected by their forms to represent them as the voice of the school. Every form in the school is represented by at least one pupil and we are looking forward to witness the amazing things this group will achieve this year.

During their first meeting, Pupil Leaders were asked to feedback their opinions on some of the changes that have been implemented in school during this first half-term. They felt that the corridors during lesson transition were calm and felt that moving around the school was much easier due to the new 'single file' expectation. Pupil Leaders were also complimentary about the Blue Zone, our new whole school expectation that all pupils should complete at least 10 minutes of independent work per lesson with feedback being given immediately afterwards. Year 11 are enjoying it as an opportunity to develop independence, particularly in practising exam questions in readiness for their GCSEs.

The Student Council were also tasked with their first fundraising initiative of the year! They were able to organise a cake sale in less than a week in support of SWACA and Eva House, a charity which provides safe and welcoming accommodation for women and their children when they are unable to remain in their family home due to domestic abuse.

The cake sale raised an amazing £190 which was doubled due to the Big Give match funding, meaning that the Student Council raised a total of £380 for a wonderful cause. A big well done to them!

Essential 8

All pupils must bring their Essential 8 into school every day. This will be checked in form classes every morning. Without a properly stocked pencil case and bag, a pupil is putting up their first hurdle to making excellent progress – for themselves and their peers.

If your child arrives to school after 8:30am and/or fails to bring in their basic Essential 8 equipment (pen, pencil, ruler, purple pen, timetable and bag). They will receive a break time detention that day.

If they fail to attend this detention then they will receive an hour's detention on Friday with a member of the Leadership Team. Parents will be informed about this detention from a notification on their Class Charts parent App.


