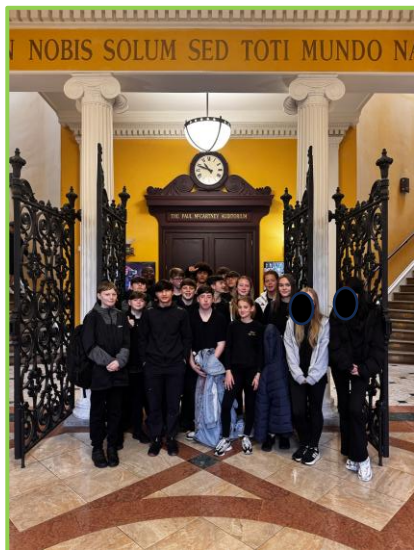
Annie is coming to Hillside on 15th & 16th July, tickets are on sale via the parent pay app now!
