



Dear Parent/Guardian,

We have been informed that your son/daughter is required to self-isolate. Where a pupil needs to self-isolate they are expected to engage with remote learning from home. It is important that they continue with their learning if they are well enough to do so. It is imperative that you contact the school to keep us informed with regards to the nature of the absence.

I have included below details of learning that your son/daughter can access either through a laptop/computer or using their mobile phone. These are all systems which have been regularly used by pupils and they should know their passwords. It is also important that your son/daughter checks their emails and Teams accounts each day for any communication from their class teacher. There is guidance and support for passwords on our website, I have included the email addresses of Subject Leaders, if you have any difficulty with accessing this learning please contact the relevant member of staff.

Seneca for science - This is an online tool that guides pupils through revision and quizzing activities set by their teacher. <https://senecalearning.com/en-GB/>

Hegarty Maths – Hegarty Maths is an online programme for pupils to access a range of activities and resources to help them master their maths skills. <https://hegartymaths.com/login/learner>

TT Rockstars (Year 7 & 8 only) - TT Rockstars is an online programme which supports pupils recall their times tables. All pupils in year 7 and 8 have individual login details given to them by their maths teacher. When they have logged in they need to click play and choose from one of the single player games, it will include a variety of different times tables questions that the pupils need to answer. <https://play.ttrockstars.com/auth/school/student>

Language Gym – Language Gym – This is an online programme for pupils to access a range of activities to help them practise their Spanish listening, reading and writing skills. <https://www.language-gym.com/> . Pupils should have an access code from their teachers to activate their profiles.

Reading – pupils should be aiming to read 30 minutes everyday and try to read both fiction and non-fiction texts. Regular reading is the best way to improve vocabulary.
