World Autism Awareness Day

World Autism Awareness Day 2024 will be observed on April 2, 2024. The day was established by the United Nations General Assembly on Resolution 62/139 in 2007. The aim is to raise awareness about people with autism spectrum condition and support research finding new ways to improve wellness and inclusion for all autistic



Autism spectrum condition (ASC) is a developmental condition caused by differences in the brain. People with ASC often have difficulty with social communication and interaction, and restricted or repetitive behaviours or interests. People with ASC may also have different ways of

learning, moving, or paying attention.

It is estimated that worldwide about 1 in 100 children has autism. However, this is a conservative figure and around 10% of pupils at Hillside have diagnosis of, or are awaiting a diagnosis of Autism. Therefore it is likely that you, one of your friends, classmates or siblings have this condition.

Over the past two years staff and pupils have been working hard to support our Autistic pupils to become more Autism Friendly. Here are just a few of the things we do...
